

**Emergency Shelter of Northern Kentucky**

LIFE SAVING. LIFE CHANGING

“It’s so warm in here...”

Those words are music to the ears of Kim Webb, executive director of the Emergency Shelter of Northern Kentucky. Those words mean the shelter has provided welcome relief from the cold for a homeless person, perhaps even saved their life.

“When the temperature is below freezing, we won’t turn anyone away,” Webb told members of the Florence Rotary Club at a luncheon meeting on Monday, January 30.

Webb said the Emergency Shelter of Northern Kentucky at 634 Scott Street in Covington is the only emergency night-time cold shelter in Boone, Kenton and Campbell counties. It also offers



“the only consistent summer shower and laundry outreach.”

The emergency shelter operates in “life saving mode” from November 1 to March 30, providing a place to spend the night for all-comers with a photo ID when the temperature is below 32 degrees. The facility also will take in referrals from hospitals or law enforcement agencies, according to Webb.

“Our goal is that no one in Northern Kentucky will die of exposure,” she said.

Homeless men and women can come in at 6 p.m. and stay until 9 a.m. the next day. They will receive an evening meal and breakfast, and laundry, showers, clothing and personal hygiene items if needed.

Webb said the people who come to the shelter aren’t typically people who have chosen to live on the streets. Many are temporarily unemployed or underemployed and cannot afford housing. Others have been doubling up with family members or living in substandard housing or their automobile.

“It’s hard to admit you’re homeless,” Webb said. “It’s even harder to come to our door.”

The shelter switches from life saving mode to “life changing mode” from May 1 to October 31. The summer program not only includes shower and laundry outreach Monday through Friday, but also helps homeless men find permanent housing.

For example, a 61-year-old man who lost his job and suffered a stroke “decided to give the shelter a try for two weeks,” Webb said, after he was forced to live with friends for a while. The shelter took him to the hospital to get him back on track with medication for diabetes and ultimately helped him move into an independent living facility.

“That was life-changing for him” and his two sons, Webb said. “One had a child and now he had a nice place for them to visit.”
