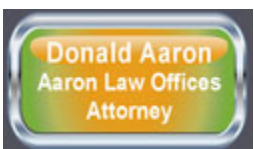

The Rotary Foundation Future Vision Plan

The Rotary Foundation [Future Vision Plan](#) aims to increase efficiency and develops more strategic focus for the Foundation. A three-year pilot of the plan's new grant structure began July 2010 and involves about 100 Rotary districts worldwide. Clubs in pilot districts do not participate in current Foundation programs (except for PolioPlus and Rotary Peace Fellowships). Instead, pilot districts may apply for district grants, which will enable them to carry out local and international projects of their choice, and global grants, which support projects and activities in six areas of focus: peace and conflict prevention/resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy, and economic and community development. During the pilot, the Foundation will phase out current educational and humanitarian grants and refine the plan for participation by all Rotary districts in July 2.
