HERITAGE HALL OF FAME

A Northern Kentucky native who has played leadership roles at the club and district levels has been named to the Rotary Club of Florence Heritage Hall of Fame.

Jerry Hodges of Cold Spring was inducted during a Florence Rotary ceremony at the Hilton Cincinnati Airport on Monday, June 18.

A Rotarian for 32 years, Hodges is a two-time Rotary president in Newport. He also served in 1999-2000 as governor for Kentucky District 6740, which comprises 38 Rotary clubs east of I-75 in the commonwealth.

"Jerry always has had the class, always has had the energy and always has had the humility" to make a difference in the community, said Dennis McEvoy, chair of the selection committee.

Hodges graduated from Newport High School and the Ohio College of Applied Science, specializing in labor relations and industrial psychology. He retired as branch manager of IPC Information Systems after 42 years in the communication industry.

He also put his communication skills to work in Rotary activities. A member of the Rotary Club of Florence since 2008, Hodges currently oversees the sound system and graphics for the annual Christmas concert

fund-raiser. He and his wife, Joy, also started sponsor button ads to raise funds for scholarships on two Rotary club websites they established.

"Joy and I are always partners in what we do, and Rotary is a part of that," Hodges noted.

The Hodges have led efforts in Rotary to support cultural understanding. Hodges served as district outbound chair (1995-96) and inbound coordinator (1996-98) for the Group Study Exchange. The group study program enabled people from other countries to experience the host country's culture and institutions. They also have been active in the Youth Exchange, which sponsors international student exchanges for young people 15-19.

The Hodges both are Paul Harris Fellows and Benefactors.

They not only helped place students, but also took bus trips with kids all

over the United States, according to Gary Stewart, a Florence Rotarian and past district governor.

Hodges was named the Businessman of the Year by the Campbell County Future Business Leaders of America in 1994 and 1995.

State Sen. John Schickel, R-Union, presented Hodges with a Kentucky Senate citation and Kentucky Colonel membership during the Heritage Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

The Hodges currently live part of the year in Arizona. They have helped a local club there double in membership.
