

RESET MINISTRY HELPING TO RESTART LIVES BY PAT MOYNAHAN

Grant Dawson's first attempt to help people with substance abuse problems reset their lives produced "two of the best crack houses in Covington," he said.

His second attempt at a faithbased residential treatment approach boasts a 90 percent success rate - still clean a year later - and more than 25 professions of faith.

"Step by step, one life at a time, we are seeing positive results," Dawson said.

Dawson and his father launched Reset Ministries in 2010. He explained what they learned from their early experiences that translated into the ministry's current success at a meeting of the Rotary Club of Florence on August 20 at the Cincinnati Airport Hilton.

Reset Ministry now owns two homes in Newport for voluntary, residential treatment - one on Isabella Street for men the other on York Street for women. They currently house 21 people battling addiction to alcohol or drugs. Residents typically complete the program in nine to 18 months, according to Dawson, who previously worked at Life Learning Center in Covington as a teacher, coach and assistant director.

What the Dawsons learned from their Covington start-up was the importance of structure and community in the recovery process. The houses in Covington were largely unsupervised. The houses in Newport require residents to follow a strict regimen.

Reset Ministries does not accept people forced by law to go to a halfway house. Reset does not receive government funds and is not affiliated with a religious organization.

"It's a voluntary program," he said. "You have to want to come."

Residents have to get a job, pay rent (\$325/month) and submit to random drug tests, room searches and nightly curfews. They also must attend weekly life skills, recovery and Bible study meetings as well as participate in a monthly service project.

The frequent meetings together, the Bible study and the interaction with coaches and mentors has a ripple effect, Dawson said. Residents de-

velop a sense of family and community that bolsters their resolve to get sober and stay sober.

Dawson compared heroin withdrawal to the 'worst flu you've ever had multiplied by five." Headaches, fever and nausea may persist for more than a week. And the desire for alcohol or drugs never goes away.

"It's harder to stay clean and sober than it is to get clean and sober,' Dawson said.

He showed a video clip from the Reset Ministries web site in which Lori Haggard credits the ministry's faith-based approach and family environment with rescuing her.

"There's a difference in people in recovery and trying to make it and people in recovery who have God at their center," said Haggard.

"A lot of things fell through with my family, but I still had family to go to at Reset."
