

D.A.R.E Officer Drums Home Anti-Drug Message

Florence Officer Adam Argullin uses his musical background to drum up a crowd for a D.A.R.E message or a school assembly.

He puts a jingle around his left foot, slides his right foot into a metal sleeve to tap out a beat, and slaps both hands in rhythmic cadence on a rectangular wooden box on which he's sitting.

"Drumming is a universal language," he explained to members of the Rotary Club of Florence at a recent meeting.

It's the language Argullin uses to connect with students at six Florence elementary schools as the police department's D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) instructor. It's also the language he uses to talk to students about the harmful

effects of drugs at 30-plus "Stay Tuned" school assemblies each year.

Argullin grew up in a musical family in western Kentucky where he acted and played drums at age 11

at the Guntown Mountain attraction in Cave City. He graduated in 2000 from Eastern Kentucky University, where he studied criminal justice and music merchandising.

Argullin joined the Florence Police Department in 2003 and earned certification as a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE), which qualifies him to go to court and testify on anything related to drugs. He took on the D.A.R.E position in 2011 even though friends, co-workers and family questioned whether the program really had any impact on youngsters.

"I realized after my first year of teaching it that if it didn't work for someone it's because they had the wrong person in the classroom," he said. "They failed to make a connection" with the students.

Argullin found he could make a connection by combining policing with drumming.

He took off his uniform when he spoke to students, and he started telling them more about himself. They reacted by telling him the things they want to do in life.

"They see me as a person and not just a person who wears a badge," said Argullin, who was named the


Kentucky D.A.R.E. Officer of the Year in 2015.

In addition, Argullin developed the "Stay Tuned' assembly program, which he describes as a rock concert with anti-drug training in the middle and a motivational spin. He said he doesn't teach students to say no. He teaches them what drugs do to the body.

Argullin illustrates the point with a little drumming using both his hands and both his feet. It takes all four limbs working together

to get the rhythm right, he tells stu-

"You throw one drug in the mix and it kinda throws everything (in life) off," he said.
