The B-Line in Northern Kentucky is Trailhead to Bourbon Country

How do you entice the 70 million motorists and seven million airline passengers who pass through Northern Kentucky each year to stay awhile?

Give them a B-Line to a nearby bourbon distillery ... or a restaurant offering 50 brands of bourbon ... or a bar featuring 100 brands of bourbon.

That's the strategy of the Northern Kentucky Convention and Visitors Bureau. The tourism agency created The B-Line to celebrate the region's bourbon heritage and promote economic development, according to Julie Kirkpatrick, vice president of sales and marketing.

"The bourbon industry here is so rich and we wanted to take advantage of it," she said at a recent Rotary Club of Florence luncheon. They also wanted to add a "bourbon experience" to encourage travelers to spend the night here and spend their money here.

Three distilleries, five bars, and four restaurants in Northern Kentucky comprise The B-Line. Participants can collect a stamp to paste in a passport (The B-Line Guide) at each stop. If they visit two of the bars, two of the restaurants and two of the distilleries, they can receive free souvenirs, including bourbon glasses and

coasters.


The Kentucky Bourbon Trail, a tour of the state's largest distilleries, attracts 1.2 million visitors a year. Many fly into Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport but choose Lexington or Louisville as home base, according to Kirkpatrick. However, prior to Prohibition, distilleries in Petersburg and Maysville produced the most bourbon.

"We wanted to do something that talks about our proximity as the start of bourbon," Kirkpatrick said. Tourism officials envisioned The B-Line as a first stop - a thirst stop - for bourbon for people coming into the state.

The Kentucky Distillers Association, which runs the Kentucky Bourbon Trail and Kentucky Bourbon Trail Craft Tour, bought into the idea. The organization designated The B-Line as the Official Gateway Trailhead, according to Kirkpatrick.

She pointed out The B-Line and the Kentucky bourbon trails promote responsible drinking and support robust taxi and rideshare programs. The B-Line website findyoursippingpoint.com encourages participants to enjoy bourbon like a true Kentuckian: responsibly.

"You should find your sipping point; you shouldn't fall over your sipping point," Kirk-



patrick said.

Will the B-Line really attract travelers and boost tourism revenue?

The visitor's bureau saturated Pittsburgh with marketing promotions prior to the Steelers game with the Bengals in Cincinnati on October 14.

"Our restaurants and bars saw a 30 percent increase in bourbon sales," Kirkpatrick said.
