## BOONE CONSERVANCY SAVING GREEN SPACE FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS Written By: Patrick Moynahan

Think back to a time when you were a child and your family went to a park and took a little hike.

Think about the things you did. Skipping rocks in a creek ... laughing at the family dog splashing in the water.

Think about the sights and sounds. Trees reflecting on the water ... snakes and spiders and butterflies ... birds chirping and flitting here and there.

Those are the kinds of memories Dave Geohegan urged members of the Rotary Club of Florence to think about during a presentation on The Boone Conservancy at the Hilton Airport Cincinnati recently. The conversancy is in the business of creating green spaces for future generations of youngsters to create such memories.

"What you see (outdoors) is off-the-wall stuff," said Geohegan, project development associate for the non-profit conservation group. "When you go out in the woods (today), you see things you won't see tomorrow."

Established in 1999, The Boone Conservancy purchases land and accepts donations of property to preserve and manage. The conservancy either maintains the land or develops it into a park for public recreation, picnicking, hiking, horseback riding, etc.

Geohegan spent 25 years on the Boone County Planning Commission. The commission approves residential and commercial development. The rapid growth of the county over the past quarter of center means he helped create a lot of traffic, he joked.

"Now I'm working on the other side."

The other side is islands of nature that buffer population growth. Geohegan showed before/after slides of land off Burlington Pike the organization transformed into Conservancy Park in Belleview. A sand and gravel business previously operated on the land.

The gravel pit, old equipment on the property and spilled oil in places created a county

eyesore, according to Geohegan. It's now a "really neat park" with lush grassland, a picnic shelter, and a fishing lake with a .63 -mile hiking loop around it.

Visitors can take their children away from YouTube and video games awhile and help them build memories there of swallows swooping into the bird boxes in spring, of the thrill of catching that first bass in a summer fishing outing.

"A lot of the projects we are working on are kinda boring really ... until you think about the people down the line who will enjoy them," Geoghegan said.
