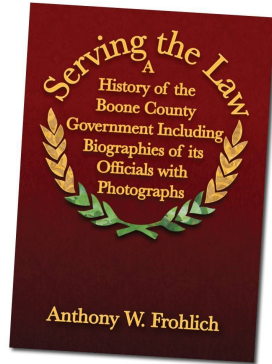

## Retired Judge Compiles Biographies of Boone County Officials

Frohlich took his seat on the bench. In searching for the information, he learned no record on who served or in what offices exists anywhere in the state.

"I worked on (the book) at night when doing the judging thing and it became really a lot of work," he said. "I cut it into two books to at least get something out in 7-8 years."

Frohlich literally spent years combing through court orders, commissions from governors, state constitutions, state stat-

utes, other public records and old newspaper articles. He also received assistance from the Legislative Research Commission, which has no complete record of state legislatures.

Former circuit judge Anthony W. Frohlich's two books on Boone County officeholders contain 428 biographies and 340 photographs, including some pictures dating to the 1800s.

"If you know the biographies of an area's citizens, you are going to know the history of that area really well," Frohlich said. "That's why I wanted to preserve the biographies of court officials and try to collect as many biographies as I could."

Frohlich, who served as circuit judge of the 54<sup>th</sup> Judicial Court of Kentucky from 2004 until his retirement in 2015, outlined the scope and challenges of documenting officeholders from 1798 to the present at a recent meeting of the Rotary Club of Boone County. The end result was two histories, one on the court system and the other on the executive and legislative branches of county government.

"A Kentucky Court," which won the Kentucky Historical Society Publication Award in 2013, traces the history of the Boone County court system from its inception in 1798. "Serving the Law," published in 2018, covers sheriffs, jailers, state legislators, U.S. congressmen and Boone County police.

Frohlich said he started working on the histories after a reporter called seeking information on a former county attorney soon after

utes, other public records and old newspaper articles. He also received assistance from the Legislative Research Commission, which has no complete record of state legislatures.

His books contain charts of court officials and county officeholders through the years as well as biographies and photographs. His charts differ in some cases from other listings, including a plaque in the Boone County Sheriff's Office.

"I guess I'm telling you that plaque in the Boone County courthouse is wrong," said Frohlich, who was named Kentucky's Distinguished Judge in 2014. "It has some wrong dates in there and some wrong people in there."

Frohlich said differences in listings are not uncommon because of gaps in records, differences in time frames used, and other discrepancies. For example, in earlier days, sheriffs assigned some of their duties to deputies or other officeholders. Frohlich found one deputy listed as sheriff who did most of his boss' duties although he was never elected to the office.

He also found the name of a state representative he'd never heard of in an 1857 copy of a Louisville newspaper after he'd finished his chart for

"Serving the Law." After months of additional research, he found the man died two months after elected and was never sworn in and never actual served.

Collecting photographs proved equally challenging. Frohlich located pictures through family members, genealogists, glass negatives from the 1860s in a state office basement and newspaper files.

"It's a lot of fun. It's a lot of work," Frohlich said.

In one case, he found the person he was seeking and two others he needed in a photograph mounted 20 feet high on an Owen County courthouse wall. In another instance, he found a small picture in a newspaper in Tennessee that published for less than a year.

"Sometimes you get lucky," Frohlich said.
