Rotary Club of Florence Continues Tradition of Honoring Police Officers during Police Week

Three years ago, the <u>Rotary Club of Florence</u>, <u>Kentucky</u> started of tradition of honoring local police officers during <u>Police Week</u> which falls during the week of May 15th. The club will be delivering boxed lunches to 189 officers in the Boone County Sheriff (including the courthouse), Florence Police Department and Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky Airport Law Enforcement departments.

In 2018, the club was able to distribute an additional 190 lunches to Fire and 911 Dispatchers due to being the recipient of a Rotary District 6740 one-time matching grant.

It takes an army of volunteers to pick up the lunches at <u>Colonial Cottage</u> on Dixie Highway in Erlanger, where the owner Matt Grimes who is also a Rotarian, provides the lunches. The volunteers take shifts all throughout the day so that officer no matter which shift they work will receive a hot meal.
