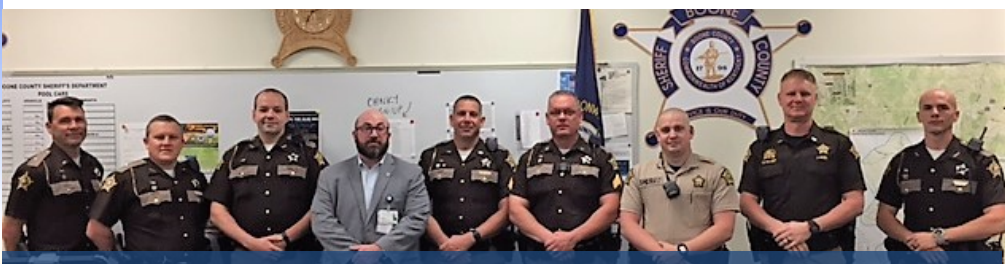

"We should be very proud of the youth we have in our community," said Barbara Rahn, chair of the selection committee. "I think too often too often hear the bad things that are happening and not the good things."

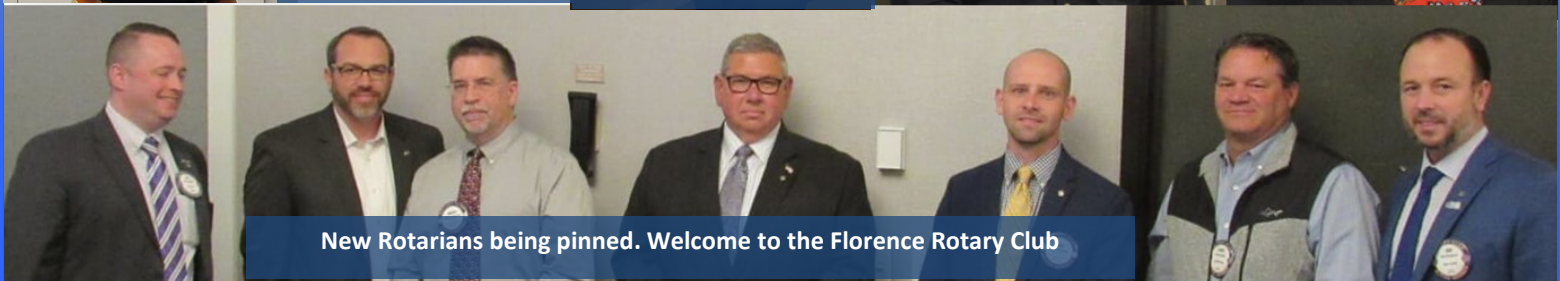
