

# Cemetery Developing into Outdoor Park

Cole Imperi wants to see you at Historic Linden Grove Cemetery and Arboretum ... as a visitor, not a permanent resident.

Administrators of the 175-year-old cemetery are turning the 22-acre grounds in Covington's urban core into a park, outdoor classroom, historical station and community gathering space.

"We are where history, community and nature all meet," said Imperi, a member of the cemetery's board of overseers.

Imperi and Peter Nerone, Linden Grove's director, outlined the board's revitalization efforts at a recent meeting of the Rotary Club of Florence. The cemetery is on the National Registry of Historical Places and an accredited arboretum with more than 300 trees and 130-plus plant species.

Among the notable people among the 22,000 buried there are four U.S. congressmen, including John G. Carlisle; B.F. Howard, co-founder of the African American Elks; Dr. Louise Southgate, the first female doctor in Covington; and Joseph Kennedy, a War of 1812 general.

The Western Baptist Theological Institute started Linden Grove in 1843, but the organization split during the Civil War, according to Nerone. The cemetery was ordered into receivership in 1948 and struggled to survive for the next 50 years.

Covington and Kenton County forged an interlocal agreement in 1998 that provides \$40,000 from each every year for oversight and maintenance. Imperi said the board is trying to create an "active, vibrant cemetery that cares about our past and our future."



The number of visitors increased 58 percent last year, according to Imperi, but most visitors don't come to visit the graves of loved ones. They come for historical tours, events and activities, and support of the arboretum.

The board began rebranding the cemetery about four years ago, Imperi said. They created a new website, a mobile app and a hashtag that have generated increased traffic on Google maps and more inquiries for historical research..

Linden Grove added two picnic areas and increased events on the grounds. The cemetery has served as the end point for an annual Memorial Day parade and celebrations for 97 years. The cemetery now offers free Shakespeare in the Park in the summer, historical programming and re-enactments in the fall, movie nights and yoga classes.

Adopt a Plot and Adopt a Tree programs began this year, and sales of plants raised on the grounds are in the works.

"We are really old but we look very good for how old we are," Imperi said.

It's no longer a place that people are ... well, just dying to get there.
