Freeing Up Our Heroes

While the Covid-19 pandemic has forced many businesses to close or require employees to work from home, those who work on the frontlines of battling this pandemic and keeping our community safe still have to report to work. Many healthcare and first responders need access to childcare so that they can have peace of mind while at work. If am proud that the YMCA responded to this call and closed our facilities to provide our Hospital and First Responder Kids

Camp. Since the inception of this program, the Governor has expanded the definition of essential employees to include those in the food supply chain and postal workers. The R.C. Durr YMCA is currently providing care to approximately 50 youth per day between the ages of 6 weeks to 12 years of age. This task comes with tremendous responsibility as it is critical that we still practice social distancing, implement a rigorous cleaning schedule, as well as provide an outlet for youth to cope with the anxiety that the Covid-19 pandemic causes.



Feeding Our Citizens

Food distribution at Master Provisions has increased slightly over 20% each week since shelter-at-home orders were issued. 190 other local nonprofits depend on as their food source to run soup kitchens, food pantries, senior feeding programs, homeless outreaches, school backpack programs and residential care programs. 131 of the 190 groups serve Kentucky residents. The current average of food distributed per appointment has increased to 680 pounds. MP operations costs have risen \$816 per week during this time of

increased demand. Volunteerism has dropped about 50% since we are limiting to 10 or less helpers per day. Our staff has stepped up to fill the gap and we have temporarily ceased clothes packing operations. Some volunteers are sewing two-ply cotton masks for St E and MP use as needed.
