

Polio Plus Day - Rotary is Winning and We Make a Difference

Join the <u>Rotary Club of Florence, serving all of Boone County (@FlorenceRotary</u>), on Monday, October 23, 2023 at noon as we hear Rotary club member <u>Greg</u> <u>Palmer</u>, President at Palmer Capital Management, Inc., sharing information about "Polio Plus Day."

Rotary International has been fighting polio since 1979, with our efforts to vaccinate 6 million children in the Philippines. In 1985, Rotary International launched PolioPlus, the first and largest internationally coordinated privatesector support of a public health initiative, with an initial fundraising target of US\$120 million. With an estimated 350,000 cases of polio internationally, in 1985 Rotary International and the World Health Organization launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.



<u>Greg Palmer</u> has been with the Rotary Club of Florence since 2002, having previously served as president and is currently District Governor Nominee for District 6740.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Rotarian <u>Josh Batchelor</u>, Funeral Director of <u>Linnemann Funeral</u> <u>Homes</u>, shared about about "The Importance of Funeral Planning and Funeral Misconceptions."

"Planning for the end of life is not anything anyone wants to talk about, it is a difficult conversation to have to talk about you or your loved one's wishes. Having decisions made ahead of time or having conversations about what you would like to happen is a gift that you can give your loved ones. My father preplanned and paid for his funeral, it made the very difficult time of his passing two years ago less stressful in that we knew exactly what he wanted which eliminated family arguments and there was not a sudden financial burden on



our family," shares Julie Pile, President of the Rotary Club of Florence. Having been a law firm administrator for 20 years, she has seen the ugly side of estate administration first hand when a loved one doesn't leave specific directions for their heirs and everyone starts arguing, often over the smallest details.

Why is having a funeral important?

- **Meaning** A funeral service can mark the significance of the life that was lived. It also helps us find meaning and purpose in our continued living, even in the face of loss.
- Expression A funeral service can allow us to express our inner thoughts and feelings about life and death.
- Support A funeral service can bring together people who care about each other in an atmosphere of love and support.
- **Remembrance** A funeral service can encourage us to remember the person who died and share our unique memories with others, creating hope for the future.
- Reality A funeral service can help us begin to truly acknowledge the reality that someone in our life has died.
