

Last week, we had the privilege of hosting Karen Brown and Julie Kugler-Ackley from the League of Women Voters of Northern Kentucky. Their presentation was both informative and inspiring, highlighting the crucial role the League plays in our democratic process.

Key Takeaways:

1. Voter Education: The League provides comprehensive voter information through Vote411.org. This platform offers personalized ballot information, polling place locations, and candidate details to help voters make informed decisions.

2. Voter Registration Initiatives: The League actively works to register voters, with a particular focus on young adults, newly naturalized citizens, and eligible formerly incarcerated individuals. Their efforts have contributed to a 90% registration rate among students at Northern Kentucky University.

3. Open Primaries Study: The League is advocating for a partisan open primary system in Kentucky. This would allow independent and unaffiliated voters, who make up

over 10% of registered voters, to participate more fully in the primary process.

- 4. Legislative Process Study: Their recent study, "How Can They Do That?", examines roadblocks to citizen participation in the legislative process. This 10-year study, covering 1998-2022, promotes transparency and accountability in our state government.
- Get Out The Vote Campaign: Through grant-funded initiatives, the League has reached over 400,000 voters across Kentucky. They've introduced the concept of "vote tripling," encouraging each person to remind three friends or family members to vote.
- 6. Upcoming Election Reminders:
 - o Last day to request a mail-in ballot: October 24, 2024
 - o Early voting dates: October 31, November 1-2, 2024

Election Day: November 5, 2024

The League's non-partisan approach to voter education and advocacy aligns closely with Rotary's commitment to community service and ethical leadership. As we approach the upcoming election, let's take to heart the League's message: have a plan to vote, tell others to vote, and stay informed about the issues and candidates on your ballot.
