



☐ Featured Article: Hope Dealing - Creating Change **Through Second Chances**

Last week, Hasan Davis, Deputy Commissioner for Juvenile Justice, shared his powerful journey from troubled youth to community leader, emphasizing the importance of hope and second chances in youth development.

* The Power of Hope

Davis introduced himself as a "hope dealer," someone who creates spaces for others to find their greater selves. His personal story illustrated how support and belief in young people's potential can transform lives.

(a) Understanding Youth Development

Key points from Davis's presentation:

- The "adolescent brain clock" concept shows how trauma can delay development
- Social-emotional skills are essential, not soft skills
- Arts and creative engagement are crucial for youth development
- 1 The importance of seeing both current challenges and future potential

Personal Journey

Davis shared his transformation from:

- Struggling with ADHD, dyslexia, dysgraphia, and family challenges
- Multiple school changes and home placements
- Initially struggling at Berea College
- Eventually becoming student body president and graduating
- Now serving as Deputy Commissioner of Juvenile Justice

Creating Change

Davis emphasized several key principles:

- Every child deserves a chance
- ★ Hope is an action word, not just a wish
- The importance of creating opportunities before expecting ability
- The power of seeing potential in youth

His message resonates with Rotary's mission of service above self and our commitment to youth development. Davis's story demonstrates how community support and belief in potential can transform lives and strengthen our community.

The presentation concluded with Davis's powerful message that hope provides possibilities and the courage to imagine a better future. His story exemplifies how one person's belief in another's potential can create lasting positive change.
