Featured Article: Housing Opportunities of Northern Kentucky (HONK)

Last week, we welcomed David Hastings, Executive Director of Housing Opportunities of Northern Kentucky (HONK), who shared the organization's mission and impact in our community.

About HONK

HONK is a faith-based nonprofit organization that helps lower-income families and individuals achieve stable homeownership through education and support programs. Operating in Campbell, Kenton, and Boone counties, HONK has:

- Built 37 new homes
- Rehabilitated 108 existing homes
- Helped 111 families achieve homeownership (soon to be 112)

Construction and Rehabilitation

HONK's approach combines:

- Professional contractors for specialized work
- Six construction staff members
- Volunteer labor to help keep costs down
- Partnerships with organizations and businesses

A recent success story includes the rehabilitation of a historic one-room schoolhouse in Elsmere, preserving an important piece of African American history while creating modern, affordable housing.

Path to Homeownership

HONK's unique lease-to-own program helps families transition to homeownership through:

- 12-18 month preparation period
- Monthly payments that mirror future mortgage payments
- Utility management experience
- Maintenance responsibility training
- One-on-one housing counseling

Group workshops on home maintenance and financial preparedness
